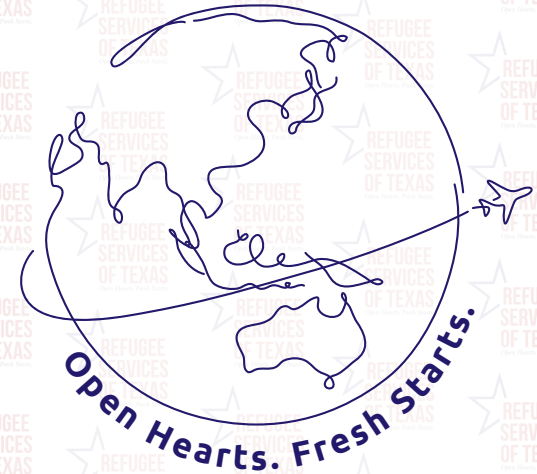

WHO WE SERVE

Refugees

People who flee their countries of origin due to a fear of persecution based on race, religion, nationality, political opinion, or membership in a social group. They are granted refugee status before traveling to the US.

Asylees

People who have left their countries of origin as refugees and seek asylum in another. They must apply for their status upon arrival in the US. Once granted asylum, they are eligible to receive refugee benefits.

Special Immigrant Visas

Offered to Iraqi and Afghan citizens who face threats for working with the U.S. military or U.S. contractors.

Survivors of Trafficking

Human trafficking uses fraud, coercion, or force to exploit another person. RST serves survivors of labor and sex trafficking, both adults and minors, domestic and foreign-born, and other victims of crime.

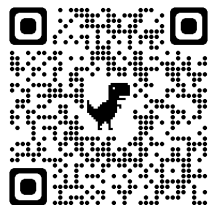
Cuban-Haitian Entrants

Cubans and Haitians who flee their country are eligible for our services upon arrival in the US. They are either granted parole or can apply for asylum.
